FROM THE PASTORS' DESK:

GOING TO THE BEAT OF A DIFFERENT DRUMMER

I REMEMBER MY HIGH SCHOOL BAND DIRECTOR MAKING AN OBSERVATION ABOUT OUR CULTURE THAT HAS STUCK WITH ME EVEN TO TODAY. IT WAS THE END OF JUNE, AND SHE WAS GETTING MATERIALS READY FOR BAND CAMP THAT WOULD BE STARTING IN ABOUT A MONTH. SHE SAID, "WELL, IT'S ALMOST THE FOURTH OF JULY, AND AFTER THE FOURTH, SUMMER WILL BE OVER." WHEN SHE SAID IT, I THOUGHT SHE WAS CRAZY. MY FAMILY USUALLY TOOK OUR YEARLY VACATION AT THE END OF JULY EVERY YEAR. SURELY SUMMER COULDN'T ALREADY BE OVER!

AS THE YEARS HAVE PASSED, I'VE STARTED TO THINK THAT SHE WAS RIGHT. FREQUENTING GROCERY STORES AND SHOPPING AREAS MORE REGULARLY AS AN ADULT, I HAVE NOTICED THE "MERCHANDISE SHIFT." BEFORE THE FOURTH OF JULY, EVERYTHING IS BBQ, RED, WHITE, AND BLUE, SUNBLOCK AND SWIMWEAR. AS SOON AS JULY 5 COMES AROUND, THE PUMPKINS IMMEDIATELY SHOW UP AS IF THEY WERE JUST WAITING ON THE RACKS TO BE ROLLED OUT. FALL LEAVES AND COLORS ADORN THE AISLES, AND THE BATHING SUIT SECTION IS QUICKLY REPLACED BY BACK-TO-SCHOOL SUPPLIES. SORRY KIDS, NO MORE SWIMMING FOR YOU. IT'S NOT JUST WHAT OUR STORES WANT US TO THINK, BUT IT COMES TO BE OUR MENTALITY IF WE'RE NOT CAREFUL. ALWAYS MOVING TO THE NEXT THING BEFORE THE PREVIOUS ONE IS FINISHED.

NOW, THIS IS JUST ONE EXAMPLE OF HOW OUR CULTURE, AND MAYBE EVEN OUR ECONOMY, TRIES TO DIRECT OUR THINKING AND BEHAVIOR. BUT IT HAPPENS IN MANY OTHER AREAS OF LIFE TOO. THE CONCEPT APPLIES TO OUR MORALITY. MAYBE YOU'VE NOTICED A CHANGE IN ENTERTAINMENT OVER YOUR LIFETIME. FROM THE MID 1930S TO LATE 1960S A MANDATE WAS IN PLACE IN THE ENTERTAINMENT INDUSTRY CALLED THE HAYES CODE, A SET OF REGULATIONS THAT FORCED MOVIEMAKERS TO MAKE FILMS THAT COULD BE VIEWED BY THE WHOLE FAMILY.[1] THAT STANDARD IS NO LONGER IN EFFECT, AND THE RESULTS SPEAK FOR THEMSELVES. WHILE NOT EVERYTHING ON TV IS BAD, WE HAVE CERTAINLY SEEN AN INCREASE OF LANGUAGE, VIOLENCE, AND SEXUAL CONTENT IN OUR MEDIA, EVEN IN SHOWS GEARED TOWARD TEENAGERS. OUTSIDE OF MEDIA, WE HAVE ALSO SEEN THE RISE IN GAMBLING, IN PARTICULAR SPORTS BETTING. IN JANUARY OF THIS YEAR, FORBES MAGAZINE TRACKED THAT 2022 HAD SEEN AT LEAST A 13.5 PERCENT INCREASE IN GAMBLING IN CASINOS AND THROUGH MOBILE APPS COMPARED TO PREVIOUS RECORDS, AND THAT NUMBER IS ONLY EXPECTED TO INCREASE IN THE NEXT DECADE.[2] THE SCRIPTURES ARE CLEAR THAT THE LOVE OF MONEY (1 TIMOTHY 6:10) AND THE DESIRE TO GET RICH QUICK (PROVERBS 13:11) GO AGAINST GOD'S WILL FOR US, AND YET OUR CULTURE CELEBRATES AND ENCOURAGES SUCH BEHAVIOR.

THERE ARE MANY AREAS IN WHICH OUR CULTURE AND EVEN OUR OWN INDIVIDUAL APPETITES GO AGAINST WHAT THE LORD SAYS IS RIGHT AND GOOD. GOD WARNS US OF THIS IN GALATIANS 5:17 "FOR THE DESIRES OF THE FLESH ARE AGAINST THE SPIRIT". WHEN CONFRONTED WITH A CHALLENGE OF "SHOULD I" OR "SHOULDN'T I" ENGAGE WITH THIS ACTIVITY, BEHAVIOR, OR INTEREST, OUR FIRST STEP SHOULD NOT BE CONSULTING OUR OWN SELF ASKING, "WELL, WHAT DO I THINK?" OR, "WHAT IS GOING,

TO MAKE ME FEEL GOOD?" WE MAY VERY WELL WANT THAT EXTRA SERVING OF DESSERT, BUT IS IT GOOD FOR US? IS IT GOING TO MAKE US SICK? RATHER THAN LOOK TO OUR OWN DESIRES, WE ARE TO LOOK TO THE WILL OF THE HOLY SPIRIT AND ASK GOD FOR DIRECTION. "LORD, WHAT WOULD YOU HAVE ME DO?"

THERE ARE MANY VOICES, INCLUDING OUR OWN, TRYING TO TELL US OR ENCOURAGE US AS TO WHAT TO DO, BUT THE CHIEF MOST VOICE TO WHOM WE SHOULD BE LISTENING IS JESUS' VOICE. WHEN THE DISCIPLES ARE ARGUING ABOUT WHO IS THE GREATEST AMONG THEM, THEY START BY MEASURING THEIR WORTH BY STATUS AND POSITION. BUT JESUS CALLS THEM TO MEASURE BY A DIFFERENT STANDARD: "YOU KNOW THAT THE RULERS OF THE GENTILES LORD IT OVER THEM, AND THEIR GREAT ONES EXERCISE AUTHORITY OVER THEM. IT SHALL NOT BE SO AMONG YOU. BUT WHOEVER WOULD BE GREAT AMONG YOU MUST BE YOUR SERVANT, AND WHOEVER WOULD BE FIRST AMONG YOU MUST BE YOUR SLAVE, EVEN AS THE SON OF MAN CAME NOT TO BE SERVED BUT TO SERVE, AND TO GIVE HIS LIFE AS A RANSOM FOR MANY" (MATTHEW 20:25-28). JESUS SAYS TO HIS DISCIPLES THAT THEY SHOULDN'T MEASURE THEIR WORTH IN THE SAME WAY THE NON-BELIEVERS DO — "NOT SO AMONG YOU" HE SAYS. RATHER AS JESUS' DISCIPLES THEN AND NOW ARE TO MEASURE OURSELVES AND LIVE ACCORDING TO HIS STANDARD — "EVEN AS THE SON OF MAN CAME NOT TO BE SERVED BUT TO SERVE". JESUS IS OUR STANDARD, AND IT IS ACCORDING TO HIS EXAMPLE, HIS WORD AND HIS COMMAND THAT WE ARE TO LIVE OUR LIVES, NOT BY WHAT THE CULTURE OR OUR OWN DESIRES TELL US.

AS WE SEE THE FALL DECORATIONS FLOODING OUR STORES, LET US FIGHT AGAINST THE TIDE. AS WE SEE IMMORALITY RISING IN OUR COMMUNITIES, LET US STAND FIRM IN OUR FAITH (1 CORINTHIANS 16:13-14), NOT BEING SWAYED BY EVERY WIND OF DOCTRINE BUT BUILDING OUR HOUSE ON THE ROCK THAT IS JESUS CHRIST (MATTHEW 8:24).
