#### Pastor's Message for September 2025

What then shall we say to these things? (Romans 8:31a) The Book of Romans offers the most systematic teaching in the Bible about the human Dilemma and God's solution for it. Written by the apostle Paul about A.D. 57, Romans lays out the major themes of sin, salvation, redemption, justification, grace, and reconciliation. As an outstanding teacher and leader, Paul communicates with purpose. With his words he endeavours to influence the believers in the most influential city in the world.

"What then shall we say to these things?" is a rhetorical question. The verses following Romans 8:31 speaks of persecutions, distress, famine, and other hardships, which serves as the "these things" the question refers to. The question is answered by the subsequent declaration: "If God be for us, who can be against us?". This emphasizes that God's support is the ultimate assurance. Paul then in this text is declaring that God is willing to provide for His people, having already given His Son for them.

As believers then, our response to hardship is not with despair but rather with unwavering faith that God is on our side. Despite the challenges that we go through or, are going through we are assured that God has already provided for us and will continue to provide all that we need.

Paul culminates the thought with the confident statement that no earthly or spiritual power can separate believers from God's love in Christ Jesus. We hold on to that confidence as our children and grandchildren and young relatives return to school. We stand firm in Christ as we view with certain amount of suspicion what is happening in this country and the rest of the world. As long as we remain under God's banner (Jehovah Nissi) it will well with us. And this is the message that we take to the world, evangelizing those around us.

The Elders met on Tuesday, August 12 at 7:00 pm via Zoom. The previous worship services were reviewed. As part of Outreach and Missions, we will be hosting Feeding the Hungry downtown on Saturday, September 20. We will need volunteers to help prepare the food and also to take it to the downtown location for distribution. Kid's Fest is going well. Nicki from Covenant suggested getting together a combined youth group. Possibly plan something for the end of September to meet on a Friday evening or a Saturday. The Women's Fellowship will be donating new items to the YWCA/Access York Victim's shelter for women and children. They are planning to attend the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary special worship service for the Eastern Region Moravian Women on Saturday, September 27. A luncheon follows the service. The Men's Fellowship met on Saturday, July 12 and reviewed candle making. They are hoping to make candles for our church and possibly for other churches in the future. Next meeting date is Saturday, September 13 at the church. The next communion is Sunday, October 5 (World-wide communion Sunday). Keith Rishel is the communion assistant. A new Bible Study will start on Wednesday, September 3 and will continue for four weeks. It is a Biblical journey to "What happens after we die". #### TRUSTEES NEWS

The Trustees met on Tuesday, August 26 via Zoom. Shawn from Ausherman Painting went over painting details requested on outside of church. He gave a quote of \$5,785.00 to paint and repair exterior doors (6 door/2 porches). He also quoted \$14,210.00 to paint exterior trim on windows (19 total) and the stone sills. The board voted to go with just painting the exterior doors at this time. Will revisit the window painting in the spring. Repairs and updates were discussed for the parsonage, annex and church. Cliff contacted Community Connections to see who they use for snow removal. He received a quote from John Jackson of \$160 to clear the church back parking lot per snow event. John will take care of the sidewalks. The board voted to go ahead with this quote. Cliff submitted grant application for masonry work to repoint brick work at the church. Will hear back in October. Wanda gave the Treasurer's report with detail of income and expenses for the month. She requested board approval to withdraw \$12,000 from Morgan/Stanley to cover expenses. The board approved the withdrawal. The next workday at the church will be Monday, September 15 at 9:00 am.
