Pastor's Message for December 2025

The month of December welcomes one of the Church's most solemn and reflective season, Advent. Interestingly, Advent began on November 30th this year. Advent is significant to the Church because it is a season of preparation, reflection, and hope for the coming of Christ, marking the beginning of the liturgical year. It involves celebrating the past coming of Jesus at Christmas and anticipating his future second coming. Through practices like lighting Advent wreaths, the Church focuses on themes of hope, peace, joy, and love to guide the faithful as they wait for both the celebration of Christ's birth and His final return.

Advent marks a time of "ardent desire" for Christ's arrival, echoing the ancient expectancy of the Messiah. It's a season of holding onto hope and faith, especially during challenging times. It is a period of spiritual preparation, inviting us to make room for Jesus in our lives and hearts, particularly amidst the busyness of the holiday season. It encourages reflection on the meaning of Christ's incarnation, reminding believers of God's love and the hope that He brings. Advent has a dual focus: it commemorates Christ's first coming as a baby in Bethlehem and also looks forward to His second coming in glory. It serves as a reminder of the Christian identity and calls believers to live in a way that reflects their faith, encouraging "Kingdom ethics" and faithful stewardship between the times of Christ's comings.

A circular wreath with candles is a common symbol of Advent, where one candle is lit each of the four Sundays to represent the progression of the season and the light of Christ entering the world. Purple is the traditional liturgical color for Advent, symbolizing a time of penance and preparation. The four weeks of Advent often correspond to the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love, guiding the reflection and spiritual preparation of the faithful.

For us as Moravians we reflect on the season of Advent and Specifically Christmas in the sharing in the Love Feast and the watching of the Putz. This year separately from our Christmas eve's Love Feast, we will be having a community Love Feast at Covenant on December 14, 2025. Please invite friends and community members to share in this experience. Please also invite your friends to share in the viewing of the Putz at First from December 14, 2025 to January 4, 2026, times vary and special arrangement can be made for groups.

As we celebrate and reflect for the season of Advent and Christmas, let us be deliberate and intentional in sharing our faith with our families and friends with the intention of leading them into a personal relationship with Christ.

The Elders met on Tuesday, November 11 at 7:00 pm via Zoom. Worship services were reviewed from the previous month. Kid's Fest is going well. Bible stories continue on the Miracles of Jesus. Men's Fellowship-Kevin would like to meet soon and to do more structure. It was decided to set up the next meeting on Saturday, November 22 at 9:00 am to make more candles. The Women's Fellowship has been meeting monthly. They have requested leading worship the 5th Sunday during the month's that have five weeks. Kevin would like to have an in-person December meeting to discuss the 2026 church calendar. We can give an answer to the Women's Fellowship after this meeting. John said that we will be using the Lighting of Advent wreath Liturgy for candle lighting this year. He will be asking families to do the reading. Kevin suggested asking the children as well. The Bible Study held on Wednesdays will start again after the new year. Kevin said the church topics from the Province that Keith had inquired about last month could be discussed as a group as other people were interested also. Pastoral care to our shut-ins was reviewed. Kevin visited Mary Jones in Mechanicsburg on Sunday. She is not doing well. Her niece said they were removing her tubes today. He also visited Jeff Rishel along with Tim and Georgia Rishel and gave communion. Will be visiting Kathie Nicholas. John said that the Church Christmas party will be held on Saturday, December 13 at 1:00 pm with Potluck and games. John volunteered to bake the sugar cakes for Christmas Eve lovefeast. We will need four couples to serve. Jeannette will coordinate servers. Unity Prayer Watch will be held on Sunday, December 14. John has the time schedule and will post ahead of time for members to sign up. He also asked for suggestions on advertising for the Putz this year. Last year's ad on the restaurant placemats was expensive. He will send letters to surrounding churches. Kevin said print brochures to hand out. John will have them printed in two weeks. TRUSTEES NEWS

The Trustees met on Tuesday, November 25 via Zoom. The meeting started with guest speaker, Devon Jones representing JMR Masonry. Devon went over quote submitted for repointing brick work on North and South side of church. Total price is \$54,000. A second guest speaker spoke later in the meeting, Kevin Boben from Boben Masonry. He went over the work they would do and quoted \$32,725 total. After much discussion, a vote was taken, and the majority voted to award the contract to Boben Masonry. A grant previously applied for was approved for \$15,000. The work will begin in the spring of 2026. Repairs and updates were discussed for the parsonage, annex and church. Ausherman quote of \$14,210 to paint exterior trim North and West side windows (19 qty.) and stone sills stripped of paint will be readdressed in the spring and we will obtain a second quote. Sanctuary right side dimmer switch is now fixed. Church roof needs resealing in the spring 2026. Employees COL was approved for 2.5% increase. Wanda gave the Treasurer's report with detail of income and expenses for the month. She will need to withdraw \$16,000 from Morgan/Stanley to cover Bethlehem's apportionments and upcoming expenses. The board approved the withdrawal. The next workday to be determined.

There will be no meeting in December.
